Governor's Award for Environmental Excellence

The Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Great American Cleanup of PA was selected to receive a 2015 Governor's Award for Environmental Excellence. The Great American Cleanup of PA is an annual program empowering Pennsylvanians to make communities clean and beautiful by removing litter and trash along roadsides, streams, beaches, parks, forests and neighborhoods. Great American Cleanup of PA 2015 Report

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful has announced the results of the 2015 Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Great American Cleanup of PA. As in years past, all 67 counties participated in this annual community improvement event. In total, there were 4,931 events with 128,157 volunteers. Volunteers collected 300,186 bags, or 6,003,720 pounds of trash. They cleaned 11,943 miles of roads, railroad tracks, trails, waterways, and shorelines, and 6,422 acres of park and/or wetlands. Additionally, volunteers planted 13,050 trees, bulbs, and plants in an effort to keep Pennsylvania beautiful.

This annual event is held in conjunction with Keep America Beautiful's Great American Cleanup and in partnership with support from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, PennDOT, Pennsylvania Waste Industries Association, the Pennsylvania Food Merchants Association, Weis Markets, Inc., Wawa, Inc., Sheetz, ShopRite and The Fresh Grocer. Additional 2015 event supporters include: Steel Recycling Institute, Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority, Giant Eagle Inc., Giant Food Stores, Inc., Republic Services and Wegmans Food Markets.

KPB Will Offer Overview of Illegal Dumping in PA to Magisterial District Justices

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful is partnering with the Minor Judiciary Education Board to provide a Continuing Education Course to Magisterial District Judges on illegal dumping in Pennsylvania during the 2015-2016 Academic Year. KPB will offer a factual presentation on the way waste and recycling is managed in Pennsylvania, the scope of illegal dumping in Pennsylvania, environmental, social and economic impacts on our communities, as well as the results of a 2013 Public Opinion Poll related to enforcement, cleanup and prosecutions.

Illegal Dump Free PA Program Aids in Prosecutions

Surveillance support cameras on loan from Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's <u>IllegalDumpFreePA.org</u> program provided key evidence in recent prosecutions in <u>Allegheny</u> and <u>Cambria</u> Counties.

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Partners with Community Foundation for the Alleghenies and Lift Johnstown

With a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful, the Community Foundation for the Alleghenies and Lift Johnstown are working together to loan eligible grantees a surveillance camera kit which will be placed at undisclosed illegal dumping hot spots throughout Cambria, Somerset and Bedford counties.

The three organizations held an <u>informational meeting</u> open to the public on July 28. Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful provided an overview of their Camera Loan Program grant that is available to Pennsylvania municipalities, local government and conservation organizations. The grant includes the loan of a set of three high quality, motion activated, covert security cameras that provide instant wireless transmission of site activity, photo documentation of license plates at speeds of up to 50 MPH, and clear photos of activity day or night, which are key to prosecutions.

Charting the Multiple Meaning of Blight

Keep America Beautiful releases <u>Charting the Multiple Meanings</u> of <u>Blight: A National Literature Review on Addressing the Community Impacts of Blighted Properties</u> (May 2015). Conducted by the Vacant Properties Research Network, a project of the Metropolitan Institute at Virginia Tech in collaboration with Econsult Solutions, Inc. This Review compiles existing research, findings and literature related to community impacts of blight including litter; illegal dumping; vacant, unkempt lots; abandoned buildings; buildings with code violations; abandoned vehicles in public right of way and on private property.

Illegal Dump Free PA Offers Camera Loan Program and Community Resources to fight Illegal Dumping

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful has recently launched Illegal Dump Free PA, an online toolkit that offers public and stakeholder education materials, surveillance support grants and a municipalities toolkit.

The <u>Surveillance Support Program</u> includes the loan of a set of three high quality, motion activated, covert security cameras that provide instant wireless transmission of site activity, photo documentation of license plates at speeds of up to 50 MPH, and clear photos of activity day or

The <u>Municipalities Toolkit</u> includes sample letters to legislators and district magistrates, as well as a sample media release, op-ed, and letter to the editor. All are customizable and can be used by local governments or local citizens to help bring the issue of illegal dumping the forefront.

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Invites PA Residents to Participate in the International Coastal Cleanup

In 2014, 12,809 volunteers from 50 counties canvassed their communities to remove 646,210 pounds of trash and debris from Pennsylvania's waterways and coastal regions during the International Coastal Cleanup event.

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Celebrates 25 Years by Providing 25 Grants for Community Improvements
