**Electronics Recycling Update**- On May 4, 2016, Representative Ross introduced HB 1900, An Act amending the act of November 23, 2010 (P.L.1083, No.108). On May 9, it was referred to the <u>House Resources and Energy Committee</u>. Representative Ross summarized the amendment as follows: "My legislation would create an opportunity for private contractors to bid on collecting, transporting and recycling the amount of electronic waste in each county that is not currently being accounted for by the

existing system. The cost would be apportioned to the manufacturers on the same market share basis currently being used in the existing law. As in the existing law, manufacturers would be able to bid to take care of their obligations." To see Representative Ross' full co-sponsorship memorandum, click <a href="here">here</a>. The award honors the power of well-designed websites and online communications to attract audiences, disseminate ideas and information, generate response, and promote products, services and ideas. Only 15% of 1,250 entries were recognized demonstrating that KPB's eWastePA.org is a powerful education tool for Pennsylvania as it continues to work to address e-waste recycling in Pennsylvania.

# KPB Distributes 25 Recycled Content Benches Donated from GIANT Food Stores' Bags to Benches Program

#### Does Your Municipality have a Litter Problem?

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful invites local residents, organizations, civic groups, and businesses to commit to litter free communities by joining their statewide adoption program. The program is an option for most types of local areas, such as municipal roads, communities, parks, neighborhood blocks, greenways, waterways and trails.

According to Keep America Beautiful's 2009 National Visible Litter Survey and Litter Cost Study, litter clean up costs the U.S. more than an estimated \$11.5 billion each year with municipalities spending more than \$790 million and counties spending \$185 million each year. The KPB Adoption Program helps mitigate the costs associated with cleaning up and encourages partnerships between local residents and municipalities.

#### KPB Receives \$20,000 Grant to Continue Cigarette Litter Prevention Program (CLPP)

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful will partner with the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) and Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) to implement CLPP in seven Pennsylvania State Parks with recreational lakes including Bald Eagle, Kooser, Moraine, Neshaminy, Prince Gallitzan and Pymatuning. KPB will also conduct education and outreach to the 65 charter fishing boat companies which are licensed by the Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission and the marinas from which they sail. Read more.
