## **Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Distributes 25 Recycled Content Benches donated from GIANT Food Stores and MARTIN'S Food Markets Bags to Benches Program**

(May 22, 2017) – In recognition of Earth Day, GIANT Food Stores donated 25 benches made from recycled plastic bags to Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's Litter Free School Zone Program as part of GIANT'S ongoing Bags to Benches initiative. The 25 benches were placed on school grounds across the state as part of campus restorations and playground enhancements. Since 1997, more than 1,500 benches have been donated to local fire departments, churches, schools, townships, parks and playgrounds.
