According to Keep America Beautiful's 2009 National Visible Litter Survey and Litter Cost

Study, litter clean-up costs the U.S. more than an estimated \$11.5 billion each year with municipalities spending more than \$790 million and counties spending \$185 million each year.

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful partners with local municipalities to help mitigate the costs associated with cleaning up by encouraging local residents to take ownership of their communities. Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful provides a sign recognizing the groups or individuals who have adopted the road or area and seeks the support of the local municipalities to provide the sign post, install the sign and provide trash disposal options as needed.

Such is the partnership with Upper Mount Bethel Township in Northampton County. John Bermingham, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the township believes the partnership is a win-win. "When I approached Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful about supporting our Upper Mount Bethel Clean-Up Program, they were more than willing and thanked us for doing it. They educated us on what to say to our volunteers and provided safety information about cleaning up roads that we did not think of ourselves. I encourage any municipality who wants to clean up their roads, to reach out to Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful for assistance. They are there to help train, educate and support any municipality who wants to keep Pennsylvania beautful."

"We are so grateful that municipalities like Upper Mount Bethel see the value in participating in our programs. The benefits of removing roadside litter are broad.
