Pennsylvania Teachers Invited to Participate in Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's Litter Free School Zone Program

(March 31, 2021) Schools can keep their school grounds litter free with Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's Litter Free School Zone. The program encourages hands-on activities to teach environmental stewardship and responsibility and can be incorporated into Earth Day celebrations and lesson plans.

There are currently over eighty schools participating in the program. All schools are welcome to participate - elementary school, middle school, high school, public or private.

"This program provides a fun and easy way for students to work together, learning valuable community leadership and responsibility skills, while gaining a respect for the environment and the world around them. Litter Free School Zone events can get free cleanup supplies through Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's <u>Pick Up Pennsylvania</u>, a statewide community improvement initiative. Registered events receive free cleanup supplies like bags, gloves and safety vests curtesy of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, PennDOT and Keep America Beautiful.
