KPB Works with State Parks to Reduce Cigarette Litter

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful is partnering with the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) for implementation of the 2019 Cigarette Litter Prevention Program (CLPP) in Benjamin Rush, Nockamixion, Ridley Creek and Tyler State Parks. The program combats cigarette litter by installing ash receptacles, offering education and distributing portable ashtrays. In 2018, Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful documented a cigarette litter reduction rate of 81% in program areas.

Cigarette butts are the most littered item in the U.S. and across the globe.¹ Tobacco products comprise 38% of all U.S. roadway litter.²

Cigarette Receptacles in Pennsylvania

Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful, Keep America Beautiful and Philip Morris USA request your help in finding locations to place litter stands to provide opportunities for adult smokers to dispose of their cigarette butts properly. Through this program, 444 bins have been distributed to 47 cities, townships, and boroughs in Pennsylvania. Litter along Pennsylvania's roadways is unsightly and dangerous. Since 1990, Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful has offered a statewide adoption program for local roads and areas for residents, organizations, civic groups, and businesses to be part of the solution.

"When we first started, we collected over a hundred pounds of trash in just 0.6 miles. But as we've been cleaning up, we've noticed other businesses in the area are starting to be more proactive and are helping by maintaining their areas. Litter Free School Zone

The Litter Free School Zone Program encourages young people to play an active role in improving our environment through recycling, litter awareness and community stewardship. Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful provides a sign recognizing the participating school as a Litter Free School Zone. The school, in turn, organizes two cleanups or beautification events each school year.
