









### 42 Environmental Grants Awarded

Over \$500,000 to create or improve green spaces



With support from The GIANT Company, Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful (KPB) awarded 42 Healing the Planet grants to nonprofits in Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia for projects that build environmental stewardship by connecting people with community green spaces. More than \$500,000 was granted for park improvements

## A Statewide Littering Prevention Campaign

Litter cleanup is extremely costly and despite amazing help by thousands of Pennsylvanians, trash keeps piling up. To shift focus to litter prevention, KPB is supporting PA Department of Environmental Protection and PennDOT in developing a littering prevention action plan guided by KPB's Pennsylvania Litter Research Study and a nationally recognized model of behavior change. ### Supporting the International Coastal Cleanup

Whether you are cleaning up a favorite waterway, local park or the street you live on – it all makes a difference in reducing the amount of litter reaching our oceans. Participate in Pick Up Pennsylvania from September 1 through November 30 and get free trash bags and gloves, provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, PennDOT and the Ocean Conservancy, as supplies last. Last year, nearly 12,000 volunteers removed 900,250 pounds of trash and tires from our lands and water. # Cigarette Litter Prevention Program

Littered cigarette butts contaminate soil and ground water with chemicals and heavy metals; fatally impact wildlife who mistake them for food; and the cellulose acetate filters never fully decompose. The Cigarette Litter Prevention Program provides educational tools, pocket ashtrays and funding for receptacles to reduce cigarette litter. With a \$20,000 grant from Keep America Beautiful, Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful will continue their work this year in state parks including Sizerville, Little Buffalo, Cowans Gap, Laurel Hill, Keystone and Ryerson Station. Through a partnership with Terracylce, collected waste will be recycled and composted. To date, Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful has implemented the Cigarette Litter Prevention Program in 35 of the 121 state parks, for a combined reduction rate of 67%,
