Ambassadors are committed to making Pennsylvania the best place to live, work and play through volunteerism, civic engagement, and community stewardship. Pennsylvania 10th,11th and 12th grade students are eligible for the Young Ambassadors program and if accepted, must commit to full participation from September 2023 to May 2024.
