What is Pick Up Pennsylvania?

- Pick Up Pennsylvania is a year-long initiative!
- Events types: litter and illegal dump cleanups, community greening and beautification, special collections and education events.
- Events scheduled from Mar 1 May 31 & September 1 November 30 receive FREE trash bags, gloves, and safety
 vests as supplies last.
- April 1 through April 30, PA DEP and Pennsylvania Waste Industries Association sponsor free or reduced trash disposal at participating landfills.
- Events must be registered at <u>keeppabeautiful.org</u> to receive free cleanup supplies and be eligible for free or reduced cost disposal.

Pennsylvania Litter Research and Cost Study

KEY FINDINGS

- > 502 million pieces of litter on our roads
- > 37% comprised of cigarette butts
- 30% comprised of plastics with plastic film and beverage containers most prevalent
- PENNDOT spends upwards of \$13 million per

year picking up litter along state-owned roadways

- Cities spent 68.5 million dollars managing litter and illegal dumping, 80% of those dollars just on cleanup

Where Does Litter Come From?

- Open Dumpsters
- Recycling/trash bins lacking lids
- Blown from waste hauling vehicles and uncovered loads
- Motorists littering from cars
- Pedestrians
- > Overflowing public trash cans
- > Not everyone views some trash, like cigarette butts, as litter

How Does All This Litter Affect You and Your Community

- Negatively impacts community pride and others' perceptions of the health of a community, and can impact business development, tourism and property values.
 - > 36% of business development officials say litter impacts a decision of whether they locate to a community
 - ➢ 55% of realtors think litter reduces property values by about 9%
 - ➢ 60% of property appraisers would reduce a home's value if it was littered
- > Degrades the natural environment. Most trash takes years, even centuries, to break down.
- > Can leach chemicals, and break into microplastics, creating hazards for unsuspecting wildlife.
- Heavy rains can transport litter through storm drains into nearby waterways releasing pollutants, threatening aquatic life, and interfering with uses of our marine resources.
- > Attracts disease-carrying mosquitoes and rodents.

Litter is Costly

Litter and illegal dumping are a significant drain on state and local governments.

- Nine cities in PA spend 68.5 million annually on litter and illegal dumping.
 - 80% on cleanups
 - 1% on education
- PennDOT spends roughly \$14 million annually on statewide litter pickups.

For every dollar that is spent cleaning up litter and illegal dumping, it is one less dollar available for beneficial community services like fixing our roads and building and maintaining our parks.

- Department of Environmental Protection sponsors Pick Up Pennsylvania and PennDOT distributes cleanup supplies to registered events

How to Build a Successful & Sustainable Community Wide Cleanup

Planning and Recruiting Volunteers

- 1. Choose a date that is consistent each year (second Saturday in March)
- 2. Participate in **PICK UP PENNSLVANIA** to access free cleanup supplies and free or reduced disposal
- 3. Ideas of places to recruit volunteers:
 - Local, county and state agencies
 - Local magistrates
 - County adult and youth probation departments for community service hours
 - > Area high schools and sports teams for community service hours
 - County conservation districts and local watershed and environmental organizations
 - County and local chamber of commerce, PA Downtown and Main Street organizations and civic organizations (Rotary, Lions Clubs)
 - Local universities, colleges and trade schools
- 4. Utilize local fire and police departments for safety on the day of event

How to Build a Successful & Sustainable Community Wide Cleanup

Marketing and Promotion

- 1. Local newspaper, radio and television station, social media
- 2. Community websites, library and chamber of commerce members/local business social media
- 3. Printed flyers on local pizza shops/restaurants outgoing orders
- 4. Reach out to state and local legislators to promote event to their constituents
- 5. Work with United Way for the Day of Caring
- 6. Work with local universities, colleges and trade school



How to Build a Successful & Sustainable Community-Wide Cleanup

Community Involvement and Helpful Hints

- 1. Ask local restaurants/grocery stores donate snacks and drinks for volunteers
- 2. Involve local places of worship to help with planning and promoting and day of event
- 3. Invite local media or have someone document the day and send to local media
- 4. Giveaways for the groups that picks up the most trash, most unique item, most volunteers, etc.
- 5. Don't try and clean every roadway in the community at once. Ex: state roadways in the spring and local roadways in the fall
- 6. Organize a litter-themed poster contest with local schools and youth programs

How to Register and Important Program Dates

Pick Up PA



Every Litter Bit Matters when it comes to keeping Pennsylvania clean, and it's up to all of us to do our part. By working together to Fight Dirty, everyone in Pennsylvania can live, work, and play in a clean and green community.

One little way to Fight Dirty is to register an event for Pick Up Pennsylvania:

- March 1st through May 31st. Our spring event in support of The Great American Cleanup is eligible for FREE work gloves, safety vests, and trash bags as supplies last. Donated landfill space for trash collected during the cleanup is also available for free or reduced cost between April 1st through April 30th.
- June 1st through August 31st. Events can be registered in the summer but are not eligible for free supplies at this time. Please also be aware of the additional safety concerns for summer events in PA like ticks, snakes, vegetation, and poison ivy.
- September 1st through November 30th. Our fall event in support of The International Coastal Cleanup is eligible for FREE work gloves, safety vests, and trash bags as supplies last. There is no donated landfill space for the fall event.
- December 1st through February 28th. Events can be registered in the winter but are not eligible for free supplies at this time. Please also be aware of the additional safety concerns for winter events in PA.



Important Program Notes

Remember:

- All registered events are eligible for FREE work gloves, safety vests, and trash bags (courtesy of PennDOT, and PA DEP) while supplies last.
- Members of the <u>Pennsylvania Waste Industries Association</u> and other landfill owners, along with the <u>PA DEP</u>, have graciously donated landfill space for trash collected during the cleanup. Please note that free or reduced landfill space is available only between April 1st through April 30th. Everyone who registers an event with Pick Up Pennsylvania will be given access to a list of services and supplies available in their area. As a reminder, there is no free tire disposal for Pick Up Pennsylvania. To properly dispose of your tires, visit the <u>PA DEP's list of permitted tire recyclers and processors</u>.
- · Plan for proper disposal of any electronics that are found.
- Community Cleanup Day events held for residents to clean out their households are not eligible for the Free or Reduced Disposal Days (which is between April 1st through April 30th).
- Please be aware that some lands may be open for hunting or trapping even on some Sundays. For current seasons and dates for your cleanup location, visit <u>the PA Game</u> <u>Commission</u> for the most up-to-date info.
- Please contact your local PennDOT office in a timely manner prior to your event to ensure your group receives enough gloves, vests, and trash bags as supplies are limited and this also gives them ample time to process your request.

1. Get Started

Want to Fight Dirty in your community? Pick Up Pennsylvania is part of the national Great American Cleanup from March 1st through May 31st. Communities are asked to organize and conduct local cleanups - recruit volunteers, promote your event, and report your results for inclusion in statewide and national cleanup totals.

Every Litter Bit Matters when it comes to keeping Pennsylvania beautiful, so whether your event is large or small, your support is appreciated!

Business and trade organizations, state government agencies, environmental and civic organizations, and many others, have all volunteered to assist local communities with conducting successful and safe cleanups.

- PennDOT's county offices will provide free cleanup supplies, including gloves, safety vests and trash bags to registered cleanup groups, as supplies last. Find PennDOT contacts
- Environmental and civic groups will provide answers and assistance in organizing and preparing your cleanup. Find local contacts.

Types of Events

- Litter Cleanup these are the most common types of Pick Up Pennsylvania events. Grab your neighbors and friends and join in!
- Illegal Dump Cleanup Event Is your group going to cleanup an illegal dumpsite? Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful has a publication that will be useful for your group. Free or Reduced Cost Disposal

Free or Reduced Cost Disposal is a one-month event within Pick Up Pennsylvania, in support of the Great American Cleanup. Sponsored by DEP and the Pennsylvania Waste Industries Association, Free or Reduced Cost Disposal will occur from April 1st to April 30th. It is during this time period that trash collected at registered events can be disposed free or at a reduced price at participating landfills. A link to the participating landfills is provided to the coordinator after an event is registered in the event confirmation information. Allegheny County Resources

Free gloves, bags and vests are available for Pick Up Pennsylvania registered events only. If you have not yet registered your event, please visit Pick Up Pennsylvania for program information and registration.

To request the free supplies, please contact the PennDOT's Adopt a Highway Coordinator in your county. Have your *event ID* handy when contacting the Coordinator. Please note, supplies may not be available all year but when they are, they are only available until supplies last. So, register your event early!

Trash Disposal and Safety

4. Trash Disposal (If you can not dispose of the trash yourself)

- State maintained roadways (roads in which PennDOT plows and maintains) we suggest working with the local <u>PennDOT office</u> to coordinate the pick up and disposal of collected trash from the cleanup.
- Locally maintained roadways (roads in which the county, city, township or borough plows and maintains) we suggest working the local governing body and the public works
 or street departments to coordinate the pick up and disposal of collected trash from the cleanup.
- Trails and Parks, we suggest contacting trail group, park office or local government where trail is located to coordinate the pick up and disposal of collected trash from the cleanup.

Always coordinate trash pickup and disposal before starting your cleanup.

5. Safety

- Involve your local government and police in your cleanup, and make sure they are aware of your plans. Let them know where you will be, and when you plan to be there. They may be able to assist you with parking, traffic and other safety concerns.
- If you live in a community that does not have local police protection, contact your local State Police barracks for assistance.
- · Be aware of private property, and get permission from landowners before going on their land.
- · Organize into teams, and have team leaders become familiar with cleanup safety information.
- · Roadside litter can be dangerous. Do not open coolers, jugs, bottles and other sealed containers.
- Make sure volunteers wear gloves, appropriate clothing, and safety gear.
- Please be aware that some lands may be open for hunting or trapping even on some Sundays. For current seasons and dates for your cleanup location, visit <u>the PA Game</u>
 <u>Commission</u> for the most up-to-date info.
- Report any suspicious or dangerous items to police immediately.
- · Make sure children are not left unattended near highways or water.
- For volunteer safety, please inform your volunteers prior to your cleanup what remnants of a meth lab contain. <u>Download the "Meth Labs: A Recipe for Disaster" pdf file here.</u>

Utilizing the free or reduced cost landfill disposal is only for registered Pick Up PA events and only from April 1st to 30th. An event ID will be required. Also, please note that donated landfill capacity at a specific facility may change at any time, so it is important to contact them before a drop-off to make sure they are available to accomodate your load.
