Community Greening - Live Staking with Partners

Huntingdon County Conservation District is a proud member of Chesapeake Conservancy's Live Stake Collaborative program. In collaboration with Chesapeake Conservancy, the district helps plan a unique opportunity for underclassmen from Juniata College. This past year, up to **60 students** got to participate in this event. Live stakes are branch cuttings taken from riparian tree and shrub species that can take root and grow into their own tree – a process similar to propagation.

Collections

Juniata College students this past winter got to collect live stakes in an event hosted by Chesapeake Conservancy and the district in Huntingdon. Up to 60 students collected **up to 1,000 live stakes** from varying species. Students were educated in the process of live staking, and how this is a low cost and sustainable way to implement more vegetation into a stream

Planting Along Impaired Stream

These same 60 students were able to have a special experience; planting the same live stakes they collected. These stakes were planted within stream stabilization projects and will help with the effectiveness of these structures. Live stakes are a great option to plant within these projects as their roots act as a net in the soil which slows erosion and allows other vegetation to establish in the buffer.





Waterway Cleanup – Tony Seguin Memorial

Huntingdon County Conservation District in partnership with Rothrock Outfitters holds an annual river cleanup of the Juniata River. This was the 11th annual cleanup, and the first year was held in memory of Tony Seguin, an adored community member and owner of Rothrock Outfitters.

Juniata River Cleanup

This year, **up to 50 dedicated community members** helped clean up a section of the Juniata River in the Mount Union area. In total this year, we were able to get **2.31 tons removed from the waterway**. The pizza afterward was an added bonus too, of course.
