About: Allegheny CleanWays engages and partners with community groups to remove litter and illegally dumped materials, including tires, from vacant lots, wooded hillsides, alleyways, roadsides, streams and riverbanks. Each year, hundreds of dedicated volunteers participate in illegal dumpsite "DumpBusters" cleanups, join on community litter walks or board their fleet of boats to remove trash from waterways. All efforts are focused on enhancing community health and vitality. They also work on litter and illegal dumping prevention by educating students and community members as well as advocating for policies to reduce the amount of trash produced, such as reducing the use of single-use plastics and making it easier for consumers to recycle electronics (e.g., TVs, microwaves, stereos).

About: EPCAMR was chartered in 1996 by concerned Conservation Districts and represents a coalition of watershed organizations and reclamation partners across 16 county conservation districts and other organizations in the anthracite and bituminous coal region of eastern and north central Pennsylvania involved with abandoned mine reclamation issues. Members range from individuals to the active anthracite mining industry and co-generation power plants, to non-profit organizations, Counties covered by EPCAMR in NorthEastern and NorthCentral PA include Tioga, Bradford, Susquehanna, Lycoming, Sullivan, Wyoming, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Northumberland, Carbon, Schuylkill, Columbia, Lebanon, Dauphin, Montour, and Wayne. have facilitated programs for the collection of electronics, household hazardous wastes and universal wastes such as tires, lightbulbs, car batteries, lithium-ion batteries and Inkjet/LaserJet ink cartridges. The Authority prioritizes waste reduction, reuse, recycling, and composting before proper disposal. Their primary responsibility is to implement and enforce an effective system to ensure the well-being of our community and environment. The Waste Authority has an established enforcement department that oversees a court appointed community service litter collection program, a community litter and illegal dump clean up volunteer program and manages the Street2Feet litter cleanup program that utilizes homeless persons to pick litter. Our enforcement department has an extensive program for municipal waste management compliance with state regulations and county waste ordinance. The department routinely investigates illegal dumping, illegal burning of waste & recycling and every aspect of municipal waste management from storage to the ultimate disposal.
