



When people toss trash and leave it behind, all that trash must go somewhere, so in this book you'll find...




The animals live in watersheds like me and like you. Litter and trash affect us all, it's true.






When we open our eyes to litter we see how we can keep our homes and watersheds litter-free. Pretend you can see from up high in the sky the land down below where the river goes by.










Bottles and cans floated downstream to their nest. Wind blew in more trash leaving their home quite a mess.





A kid hit the ball so hard with his bat that it flew to the stream...





One of the kids spied a frog and said with a frown, "Look at this place. It's a mess all around."





They looked at the trash in the drain washing down. And they saw how the trash made a mess of their town.








Put trash in its place. That's where it belongs. To leave it behind is lazy and wrong.

Teach others NOT to litter their trash here and there. Don't be afraid to speak up and tell them you care.




Remember the ducks? Well, their eggs have just hatched. Don't forget trash and animals are not a good match.








And when you're done eating that yummy candy bar... put the wrapper in your pocket if a trash can is far.



Open your eyes to litter! It's easier than it seems. We can all work together to keep our watersheds clean.








# Across
